SAVE THE DATE: Our annual and much beloved traditional performance will be on Thursday, Dec. 20 from 4:30-5:45. There will also be a mandatory rehearsal on Wed. Dec. 19 from 1:00-4:30 (students not attending Wednesday may meet us—Resurrection Church, across from Safeway). This performance is particularly important to our students, as the admission fees will be entirely donated to causes that are important to your children. During our class meeting they discuss important community programs they'd like to contribute to and then work very hard at their performance towards "earning" funds towards their goal. Their is a great deal of pride as our students learn the joys of performance AND giving as they prepare for this show. Please feel free to invite family and friends—it's really a remarkable display of talent--and we hear from many in our community that this event really puts them into the spirit of the holidays.

WE ALSO NEED YOUR HELP in avoiding absences or early pick-ups as we prepare for this performance. As we are busy learning new choreography and lyrics as well as practicing lines, it is especially important for students to be picked up after 4:30 for the next few weeks. As each day a different dance or song is practiced, even one absence is really a week's worth of missing practice. Many of our dances involve partnering and staging and absences impact the entire group and leave partners stranded; unfortunately students missing practices may need to be excluded from certain numbers.

HERO OF HISTORY HELEN KELLER: Students this week will learn the amazing story of this week's hero. Stricken with scarlet fever that attacked her sense of hearing and sight, it took another blind person (a remarkable teacher who stayed with her throughout her life) to reach her. It was Helen's determination that led her to learn to speak, push for and her insistence to be admitted and then graduate college cum laude. U.S. Presidents, royalty and diplomats celebrated Helen for her work with war vets who had lost their sight as well. She went on to write some of the most profound words ever about the joy that is life. Afterwards our students may also to choose to enjoy the moving Disney film, The Miracle Worker.

SCIENCE: Fran has purchased sugar cane stalks for our students as he teaches about these amazing plants, their symmetry and growth patterns, etc. Fran will then discuss the history of sugar cane plantations and how they impact workers and the local community, paying particular attention to Haiti. This Wednesday, **Rowen's remarkable father**, **Monte Short**, has also agreed to speak to our students about his many years of work on behalf of the citizens of Haiti. Students will hear about amazing efforts to reach out medically to this impoverished nation as well as his upcoming trip (he is truly a modern "hero of history"); our students are very lucky and we are grateful for his time.

POETRY CLUB LAST WEEK TO EARN A PARTY: Students were asked to memorize either the poem, "If You Think" or our bulletin board "Words to Live By (grade 2) or both (grades 3-6). Students may choose to recite in front of the class or privately and will be treated to a taco and root beer float party. We extended the deadline for these poems by one more week because of Halloween. NOVEMBER'S POEM, "MEDITATION" written by student, Indra Lyons will be the new challenge over the next few weeks. It is a remarkable effort by Indra, and already 15 students have committed it to memory even though we've been calling it November's poetry challenge—please read it below—it is fabulous (SEE BELOW).

DRAMA: Jan wrote a play for the entire school, "**The Alien's Visit to Aptos on Halloween,**" or how the Barney song saved an entire planet. The students were divided into groups to create their own moves and did a great job. This week students will also perform a Jan play, "The first Thanksgiving." Student's also worked together to present a play about the pilgrims and their journey on the Mayflower and we continue to be impressed with their ability to work together with many grades involved, as well as the personal growth in acting and confidence among individuals.

COOKING: This week's students will learn how to make "Pumpkin Bars" as we celebrate the season. Last week was the ever popular "Carmel Apples" were created using just picked apples from Magic's orchards.

ART: So far we've learned about artists Georgia O'Keefe and Freida Kahlo with our wonderful teacher, Jasmine.
